This page is a collection technology tools available from the library and free on the internet, that can help make interacting with the library easier for you.

Email & Messaging



Library Email Notification - The Library would prefer to contact you via email (instead of by telephone) when you have something on hold or overdue. If you have not already, please update your account for email notification



LibraryElf.com - This is a company that lets you manage multiple library cards from a single account. You create an account with them, then add the library barcodes and PINs of the library cards you wish to manage, and LibraryElf will email you when books are due, overdue, ready to be picked up, etc. Use their website to sign up (be sure that "Merrimack Valley Library Consortium" is selected in the libraries list)



"Email Me" Bookmarklet [def] - This email function is a little different - it lets you easily send email messages to yourself. You sign up for this service with your email address, add their bookmarklet to your toolbar, and then if you find a website or catalog record you'd like to email to yourself, just click the bookmarklet and it will show up in your inbox



Meebo.com - For instant messaging (IM), users of four different IM services (Yahoo, MSN, AIM and GoogleTalk) to log into their account all from the same website. So, instead of needing to log in to each individually, or needing each service's software installed on the computer you're using, this one website allows access to all four services



When using the catalog, login with your barcode and PIN, and then add books to your MyList by clicking the "Add to my list" listed with each book. Web Site Standards and Guidelines for Library Units

Web Site Mission Statement

The OSU Libraries' web site supports the teaching, research and service activities of The Ohio State University students, faculty and staff by providing access to a wide variety of high quality information resources including those developed locally. The site organizes these resources to facilitate efficient use and easy access by a diverse audience. The site extends access to the expertise, services and unique collections that comprise our complex library system.

Adopted January 7, 1999

Guiding Principles

- 1. The Web site mission statement is meant to guide those responsible for page creation and maintenance in making design and content decisions related to audience, scope, and priorities.
- These guidelines are for pages representing departments and libraries that are part of the OSUL system. Generally such pages should exist beneath the following url: library.osu.edu/sites
- 3. The head of each unit is ultimately responsible for the content of the unit site and should be aware of and approve original and substantially revised pages.
- 4. The Libraries' Web Services Committee serves as a board of review for OSUL Web pages to ensure consistency with design and policy guidelines developed by the Committee. Any concerns will be discussed with the departments or individuals responsible for the pages. Unresolved issues will be referred to the Assistant Director for Public Services.
- Library sites should be in compliance with the general University guidelines.

Requirements

- Page creators and maintainers should insure accessibility of their pages by a potentially diverse audience including those with varying disabilities. See Ohio State's official Web Accessibility Policy. For additional guidelines and tutorials, see the Web Accessibility Center (WAC) site.
- 2. Pages should include a page title tag <TITLE> as well as meta-tags (description and keywords), to facilitate indexing and discovery by University and Library search engines.
- 3. Each site should provide the following content either on the top level page, or linked prominently from the top level page:
 - · Name of the library, clearly identified as an OSU Library
 - · Address, phone number and e-mail contact for the library
 - A link to the OSUL home page [/]: http://library.osu.edu
